

"PLAYED THE MARKET," IS NOW IN COURT

Los Angeles.—The belief that he could "play the market" for wealth and a life of ease put Schuler D. Orrell, 26, cashier of the local brokerage firm of E. F. Hutton and company, on the rough

road that leads through criminal court.

Orrell, who is married, was arrested yesterday following the discovery of shortage in the company's books which officers estimated would total \$224,000. He was held in jail, charged with embezzlement in default of \$50,000.

BLUE LAW STATIC MAY STRIKE THIS STATE ERE LONG

Opposing Campaign to Blue Laws To be Conducted This Summer in North Carolina.

Raleigh.—(INS.)—Like its little sister state, North Carolina is going to hear some more about its blue laws.

Linn A. E. Gale, national secretary-treasurer of the Association Opposed to the Blue Laws, announces that the anti-blue law association's campaign in North Carolina will be resumed this summer.

Gale also made the announcement that the famous Asheville Sunday movie or baseball test case which never came off, will be held during the coming summer, despite the many delays.

In a communication received here Gale said that he and Professor Henry Flury, assistant secretary who also is a school master, would leave Washington for North Carolina as soon as the vacation season starts.

"The delays in bringing about the Asheville test case have in no way changed our policy," Gale declared.

Gale explained that the anti-blue law association just now was actively engaged in waging campaigns in every Northern state.

"In view of this," Gale said, "the association cannot give its undivided attention to North Carolina, as charming as it is and as hospitable as its people are. But it will carry on its work there and does not intend to stop until all legislative anachronisms in the United States are dumped into the political rubbish heap."

Gale made no comment on the defeat of Representative Oscar Haywood's so-called blue law bill in the 1927 session of the North Carolina general assembly. The Haywood bill was finally amended so as to apply only to Montgomery, the author's home county, and was passed.
