There is no known cause for the act.

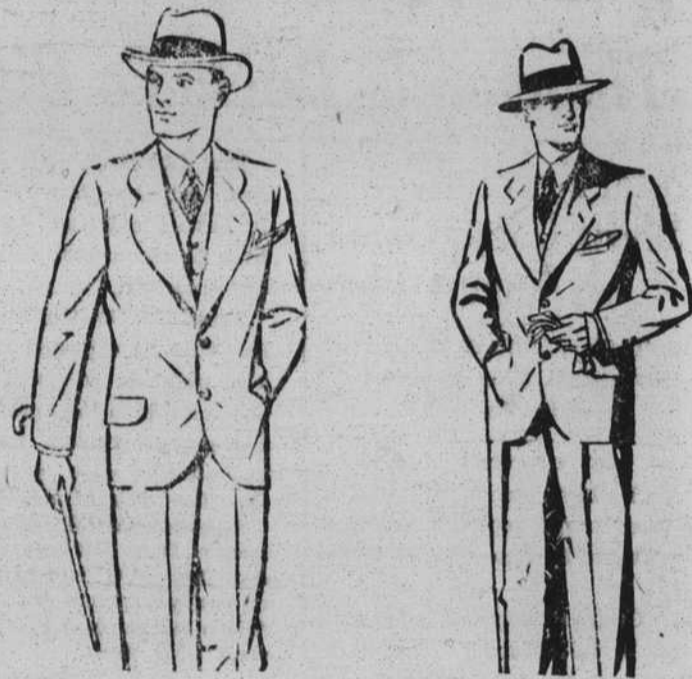
A large crowd attended the funeral services at Green Creek Baptist church today.
