Trash Department Asks Co-opera-tion of Citizens in Keeping Shelby Somewhat Cleaner.

Shelby citizens this week are being urged by C. L. Ward, head of the city garbage and trash department, to cooperate with him in making "a spotless town" by adopting the individual home garbage can

In view of the fact that many citizens have already agreed with his idea Mr. Ward has ordered a solid car load of individual garbage cans to be sold at wholesale car load prices. A 27-gallon galvanized can will cost \$3, he says, and a 20-gallon can \$2.25. This is almost half price.

The garbage department in urging every home to buy one announces that the cans will be private property of the home owners and can be moved anywhere. The cans will facilitate the work of keeping the city clean and if properly used about the homes will prevent scattered collections of garbage and trash.
