County Cotton Crop Far Ahead Of Last Year Now

Report Shows 38,987 Bales Ginned Up to November 21. May Near Last Year.

The optimists who made their guesses on this year's cotton crop seem to have it on the pessimists. Up to November 21, according to a report issued today by Miles Ware, special agent, 34,987 bales of cotton had been ginned in the county.

Up to the same date last year only 34,023 bales had been ginned, which is 4,954 bales ahead of last year.

The majority of the county cotton crop is now out and ginned but several thousand bales are yet to be ginned and in up-cotton is to be picked due to a late season while the remainder of the county had an early season.
