District Attorney Joab H. Banton is concentrating upon a search for documents taken from Rothstein's safe deposit boxes and from his home. For the moment, this activity will eclipse the homicide angle, the evidence in which, Mr. Banton said, has been assembled into "a beautiful case of circumstantial evidence."

Washington, Dec. 2.—The seat in the senate to which William S. Vare of Pennsylvania was elected will be vacant again tomorrow as the 70th congress meets for its concluding session. No does there appear to be a likelihood that this long standing dispute will be settled before the newly elected congress comes into office.

Two contests still face Mr. Vare, who is so ill at his Philadelphia home that he could not occupy his seat tomorrow were he permitted.

Diet Important In Digestive Troubles

A great many persons write me about indigestion. They want to know what diet should be followed by persons who have dyspepsia. The most distressing cases are those in which there is gas formation in the stomach. This produces the distress.

Proper diet is the essential thing. It is necessary—if there is to be relief of such digestive disturbances. Little can be done for those who are unwilling to make the personal sacrifices involved in the correction of the diet.

We are all creatures of habit. Many of our habits are good and some of them are bad. Whether a habit is a good habit or a bad habit, it is difficult to change it. If ill health is the consequence of a bad habit, he is a very unwise man who neglects to reform.

When it comes to food and eating, everybody is the creature of habit. In early childhood we learn to like certain foods and dislike others. Indigestion may be due to eating too much of the foods we like. Strange as it may seem, eating too little may cause it. It may be due to denying the system the good effects of certain foods which are essential to the well being of the body.

Gas formation, too, is the effect of over-eating or of an improper method of eating. It may be due to eating the wrong kind of food.

Of course I would be a very unscientific doctor if I contended for a moment that all cases of indigestion are of necessity the result of wrong eating. The truth is, indigestion may be a symptom merely. It may be a sign of chronic heart or kidney disease. It may be associated with gall-stones or a chronic inflammation of the appendix.

In every case of obstinate intestinal discomfort and, likewise, in all cases where there is a gas formation in the stomach or intestines the family physician should be visited. He will make a careful examination. It is particularly important that this should be done if there has been loss of weight, continual pain or occasional vomiting. Your doctor will probably advise that an X-ray picture be taken.

In a simple case where the trouble is plainly due to bad eating, there are some foods which should be omitted. Eggs are particularly bad in such cases. I am a great believer in milk as a human food, but in cases of this sort it may be necessary to omit milk from the dietary.

Avoid chowders and rich soups, hash, stews with rich gravies, fried foods, pickles, corned or cured meats, salted, preserved or smoked fish, pastry, nuts and ice water.

If you find that one particular food causes distress, common sense tells you to avoid it. Common sense in eating, as a matter of fact, is the best remedy.

Q.—What do you advise for rheumatism in the neck and shoulders?

A.—You are probably troubled with arthritis. The teeth, tonsils, sinuses, glands, intestines and sinuses are all possible points of infection and a thorough examination would be advisable in order to determine the source of the trouble. For particulars send a self
