Copeland's Health Talk Efficient Care of Infants

Somebody mailed me a poem. It may not amount to much according to the rules of poetry, but it heralds an important truth. Here is the first stanza:

"Thrilled and happy as you may be at the advent of a baby (And who wouldn't be exuberant with joy?) You will presently discover that a lot of problems hover Round the rearing of a girl or boy. Love can't be your sole reliance—it should aid, not hamper science. And, although your heart with ecstasy may throb, Sense and wisdom, too, are needed. Here's the motto to be heeded:

Know your job. Building bodies strong and ruddy is a task for toil and study.

Know your job. I don't vouch for the technical features of this poem, but I thoroughly endorse its teachings. No mother can raise her baby unless she knows her job.

Love is found in the heart of every mother. If need be, she is ready to die for her child. But, as the poet said "love can't be the sole reliance." "Building bodies strong and ruddy is a task for toil and study."

If mother and baby are fortunate enough to be able to depend on breast-feeding all is well. Under those circumstances there is little to worry over. Regularity in the feedings, and attention to fresh air and sunlight, will make the future of the baby very bright.

But when weaning time comes, or in case it is found necessary to take the breast away soon after the baby's birth, then, indeed, the mother has a real job on her hands. It is true, too, that if that baby is to thrive, she must know her job, and every detail of that job.

Preparing the feedings requires the greatest care. The utensils and the mother's hands must be clean.

When I say "clean," I mean a lot more than the removal of visible dirt. The hands of the mother who prepares the feedings must be just as thoroughly cleansed as the surgeon cleanses his.

The utensils for preparing the milk must be boiled and kept in a perfectly clean place. The bottles must be prepared with the same care.

I need not tell you that the milk must come from healthy and clean cows. It must be kept in a temperature low enough to keep it free from the suspicion of taint.

The particular formula will be prescribed by your doctor. But there must be greatest accuracy in measuring out the proportions of milk, water and other ingredients. Then the feedings must be given on a railroad schedule. The schedule must not be varied five minutes.

You can see that to know the job, is vitally essential to the welfare, indeed to the very life of the infant. It is indeed true that "Building bodies strong and ruddy is a task for toil and study."
