What do you suppose the "R" is for in the name Clyde R. Hoey? And if that one stumps you, what do you think the second "C" in this name stands for: Chas. C. Blanton?

Names are names, but middle names, even of prominent people, are usually blank insofar as the general public is concerned.

Wherewith the colyum will take charge of a little lesson on middle names of Shelby people:

It's Clyde Roark Hoey, if you care to know; and Charles Coleman Blanton for the second one.

Robert L. Ryburn really is Robert Lee Ryburn; A. V. Wray, head of the well known mercantile firm bearing his name, was named by his parents Albert Victor Wray, the two names being taken from the first names of a prominent doctor and sheriff in Shelby's past—Dr. Victor McBrayer and Sheriff Ab Suttle; Judge James L. Webb, popularly known about Shelby as "Judge Jim," is none other than James Landrum Webb when it is written in full.

Right often we've wondered what the "B" was for in the name of our boss, and now we've learned that it is "Beam," just the same as is John B. Nolan's middle name. Of course, everyone knows, or should know, that the governor of North Carolina when, and if, he writes it in full spells it out like this "Oliver Maximilian Gardner." And the parents of D. Z. Newton, the attorney, decided they would call him David Zero.

Frank E. Hoey has the initial "E" because he bears his father's name, Ernest. Double "E" Scott, the Penny manager, is, when formally addressed, Elmer Ernest Scott. All this middle name business

started, y'know, when some newspaper reporter learned that Lindy's full name was Charles Augustus Lindbergh. Well Dr. A. Pitt Beam, the molar mender, is really Dr. Augustus Pitt Beam. And if the occasion ever demands that you write it in full, it's Paris Cleveland Gardner. Perhaps he was named for Paris, the young fellow, who eloped with Helen, the comely flapper wife of the King of Troy. And C. R. Doggett, the senior, as well as the junior, was baptized as Charles Robert. Everybody calls him "Ebeltoft," as he is so well known that he doesn't need additional monickers, but his name is Theodore William Ebeltoft, and he had one or two more when christened but does not use them.

Laborer Who Gave Cousin \$100 Each Month To Save Demands Accounting From Estate.

Chicago.—For 10 years he has lived on 20 cents a day. Aaron Toma, 55, a railroad worker, told Leon Edelman, assistant to probate Judge Henry Horner, in making claim against the estate of his cousin, George Toma. Aaron seeks \$13,700 in savings he said he had entrusted to his cousin.

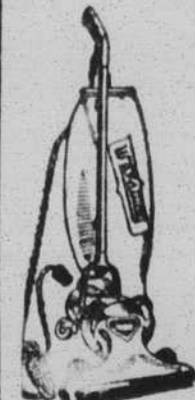

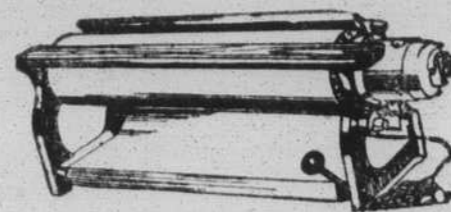
