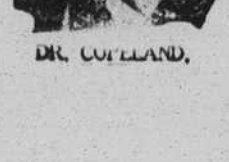

Copeland's HEALTH TALK Nervous Disease

Once in a while congress turns aside from its ordinary performance and devotes a few minutes to the discussion of matters having to do with the health of the people. When in one of these happy moods it passed the following resolution:

"Resolved by the senate and house of representatives of the United States of America in congress assembled, That the president of the United States is hereby authorized and requested to issue annually a proclamation setting apart May 1 of each year as Child Health Day and inviting all agencies and organizations interested in child welfare to unite upon that day in the observance of such exercises as will awaken the people of the nation to the fundamental necessity of a year-round program for the protection and development of the health of the nation's children."



By authority of this act of congress, the president proclaimed Child Health Day this year, May Day, which has always been given to the children, will this year and each year following, be observed as National Play Day. Recreation and playground associations and all lovers of children have applied their every effort to make Child Health Day this year the best celebration of the sort we have ever had.
