The first Thomas A. Edison questionnaire in May 1921, was given to employees and applicants for employment at the East Orange plants. It was a mixture of scientific and general information questions. Mr. Edison said it had revealed that men who had gone through college were "amazingly ignorant." His questionnaire created a widespread controversy and the University of Chicago drew up a set of questions for him to answer.
