### Copeland's HEALTH TALK

● Those Blackheads.

"Cleanliness is next to Godliness"—I am not sure that Godliness is quite so easy to acquire as all that.

Few people realize that a clean skin is the finest evidence of a clean body. If your stomach is disordered in its functions, if your teeth need attention, if you are nervous, in fact if your system does not function properly in every way, your skin signals the warning.

There may be a roughness of the skin, pimples, red spots, blotches or even blackheads. These may appear without other warning. They show that something is wrong.

Young people particularly are subject to skin eruptions. Many a young person has a face peppered with blackheads. Indeed, the face looks exactly as if particles of black pepper had been sprinkled over an inflamed and pimply surface.

When pressed between the thumb nails, a mass like a black-headed worm can be squeezed out of the skin. When left in place these blackheads produce results not unlike the effects of foreign bodies in the tissues. Pretty soon the skin festers, forming a red pimple. When the pimple breaks and the pus discharges the blackhead may escape. If it does not, the same process may be repeated and each time, the skin is involved more deeply.

The deeper into the tissues the pus burrows the larger the scar. Sometimes the swelling is great, perhaps the size of a pea. When it finally breaks, and discharges, there is sure to be considerable scar when it heals. Even after the acute condition has disappeared entirely, permanent marks will be left.

In what I have said about the causes, there have been plenty of hints as to the cure. Some of these suggestions I will emphasize.

Make sure that your teeth are sound. This is important advice for two reasons: In the first place, you need to have good teeth in order to chew your food properly. In the next place the pus from decayed or abscessed teeth may be a factor in causing acne.

You will eat green vegetables, cooked or in salad, more than has been your custom. Fruit should be taken regularly.

The blackheads must be removed. To do this, wash your face and hands thoroughly with an abundance of soap and water. Boil a watch key or hairpin to make it sterile. Then press out the blackheads, being very careful in the process. Don't remove too many at each sitting, but persist in the matter till they have been taken out to the very last one.

Plenty of soap and water used freely is the first essential to cleanliness. Do not overlook its value. By keeping the skin clean you will help to escape having blackheads.

Plump. Q.—How can I reduce?  
A.—Weight reduction is merely a matter of self-control as regards the diet. Exercise is, of course, essential.

M. C. S. Q.—What will make my eyelashes grow longer?  
A.—I would suggest that you try applying one per cent yellow oxide or mercury ointment to the lashes and brows every night.

M. J. H. Q.—What should a girl of fifteen, five feet four inches tall, weigh?  
A.—She should weigh about 118 pounds.

R. A. K. Q.—What should a girl weigh who is 14 years old and 5 feet tall?

### NO FICTION ABOUT NOAH'S BIG FLOOD

Archaeologists Have Discovered Unmistakable Evidence Of A Great Inundation.

The great deluge of Noah's time, as the Book of Genesis records it, actually occurred. At least there was a big flood at approximately that time and place in the world's history.

This discovery was recently made by the joint archaeological expedition of the British Museum and University of Pennsylvania of which Prof. Leonard Wooley of Philadelphia is the director.

Professor Wooley has not discovered the ark but even that is not outside the range of possibilities. Though unless imbedded in the earth it would not have been preserved all these centuries. But articles used by ancient civilizations that predate the ark by many years have been discovered by this expedition.

Evidence of the flood was found in the Euphrates valley of Mesopotamia. It is a deep layer of water-deposited clay under which the archaeologists have uncovered remains of an ancient people and civilization heretofore unknown. The great difference between traces left by this people and of later civilizations above it indicate that a whole race perished and that the flood must have been a great catastrophe.

However, Archaeologist Wooley believes the flood was confined to the Euphrates valley and came from the overflowing of the Euphrates River, as indicated by the nature of the water-laid clay strata. This is in conflict with the belief, gained from the Genesis story, that the deluge was world-wide. But Wooley points out that the people of that day with greatly restricted geographical knowledge might have thought the water covered the whole earth. Besides Wooley does not understand the Bible record to say positively that the flood was universal.

Remains of the pre-flood era indicate a rather high state of civilization, particularly to craftsmanship along many lines. Professor Wooley doubts whether such an advanced civilization could have been developed in the 10 generations we are led to believe passed between the time of Adam and Noah, as chronicled in the Bible.

Of course, all this depends on the rate at which the ancient peoples learned things. We know that progress of the ancients, of which we have records, was tragically slow. And it has been slow all through the ages up to the last century. Since then we have traveled at break-neck speed. Perhaps there was a period back there before the flood when folks learned fast too.

At any rate these British and American archaeologists are doing a great work in those Bible lands, shedding light on the scriptural records of man and his progress. Now if they could only discover Noah's ark!

### Snakes Article Of Trade In Sandhills

Developers of Mossiel Farm Buying Up All Sorts Of Vermin.

Southern Pines.—A curious article of commerce that has entered the field in the sandhills is snakes. When Talbot Johnson and his father, of Aberdeen, and Frank V. Dupont, and several associates of Wilmington, Delaware, and New York, as the Mossiel club, took over the big Mossiel farm of 3,000 acres, on Drowning Creek, they began plans to convert the vast estate into one of the most modern clubs in the state. They liberated several hundred pairs of Mexican quail on the tract.

They are cutting 15 miles of openings 120 feet wide through the area, and in the center of these openings they are planting cow peas, beans, millet and other grains to feed the birds. The imported birds are pairing and breeding, the native quail are also abundant, and other wild life is plentiful. The wealthy northerners will establish winter camps there on a pretentious scale.

A funny phase of the development is the result of an offer to pay for

hawks, snakes and predatory vermin of all sorts found on the place and brought in. Buying hawks and crows and similar pests, is not a new thing. But to see a bushel of snakes among the accumulation of the day's purchase is rather a novelty to the folk around here who never set a cash price on snakes before, and thought of them only as a logical reason for taking snake-bite medicine along when going fishing.

Mossiel has never been regarded as a very snaky country, but combing the three thousand acres yields a right favorable gathering of the creatures.

One thing that interferes with the possible volume of the industry is that snakes from anywhere but the home-grown product of Mossiel do not rate as having a cash value. Mossiel snake production is strictly a local industry to the club alone. No bootlegging, and no importations.
