Leave Shelby Out Of Title Playing With Large Towns Salisbury—Representative of six of the seven large high schools of the western district of the state in the recently forced class A conference gathered here and drafted a football schedule for the 1929 season. Asheville, the other member of the conference, was not represented as its football schedule had already been arranged. The school, however, will enter the conference competitions in baseball and basketball. Other schools of the western section of the state will be grouped as class B and will arrange their own schedules of play. While the western teams are playing to determine a champion on a percentage basis of games won and lost the eastern conference of eight teams will be playing a similar elimination season.
