Flag Day Means Much To Owners Nation's Homes

"For the love of home, Americans answer the call of war and march under flaunting flags to do or to die. For the love of home, there are millions armed with the weapons of peace and they are as truly under the flag as if the factory whistle was a bugle call and as if the battle of life were a battle for life.

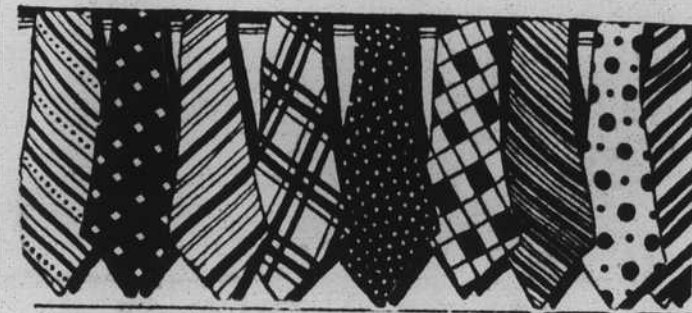

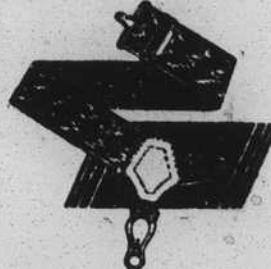
