Rev. A. C. Swofford of Gastonia was a visitor in the community Monday.

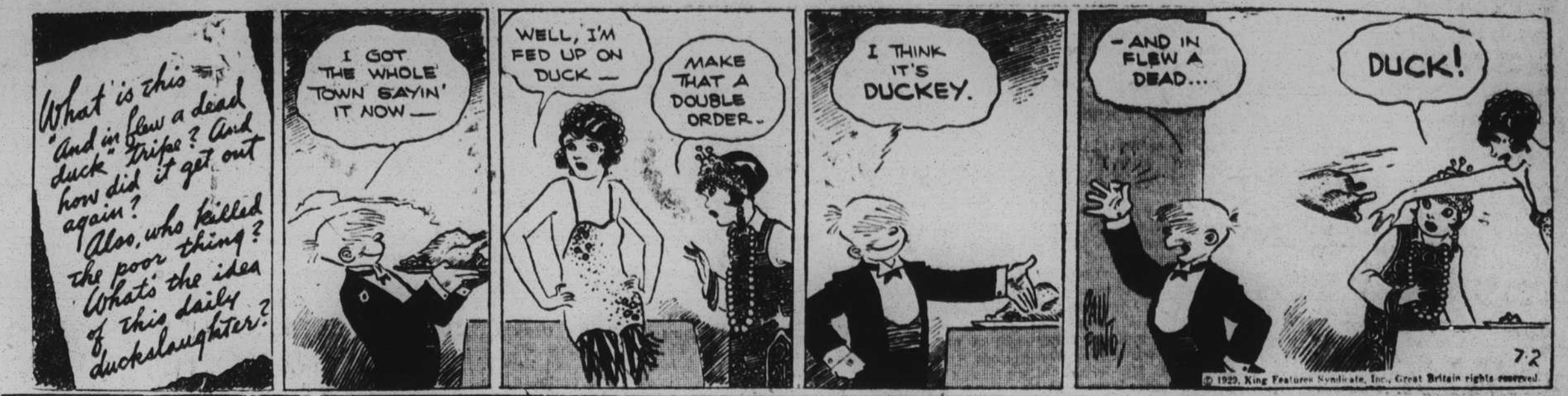
Mrs. Hoyle Elliott of Waco visited Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Helton Sunday afternoon.

## Can Dry Raiders Confiscate Horse In Liquor Haul?

Buncombe Officers Puzzled What To Do With Animal With Whiskey Strapped To Saddle.

Asheville—Can a horse, whose owner has placed several gallons of liquor across its back in saddle bags,

be confiscated? This problem confronts members of the Buncombe county sheriff's department with the arrest and seizure of a large bay horse in the Barnardsville section of the county.

Tucked away in saddle bags on the horse was three gallons of liquor. The rider of the animal escaped upon the approval of officers.

Sheriff Jesse J. Bailey makes no pretense about the seizure of the animal presenting a perplexing situa-

tion. This is the first time in the history of prohibition in Buncombe county that a horse has been seized charged with transporting.

In the meanwhile the horse means to care very little about its fate. Three square meals and a place to sleep are accorded the animal. Court attaches are wondering how he should be arraigned for trial. Some suggest that the horse be sent into court with others, insisting that the court scene would be transferred to the lively stable.
