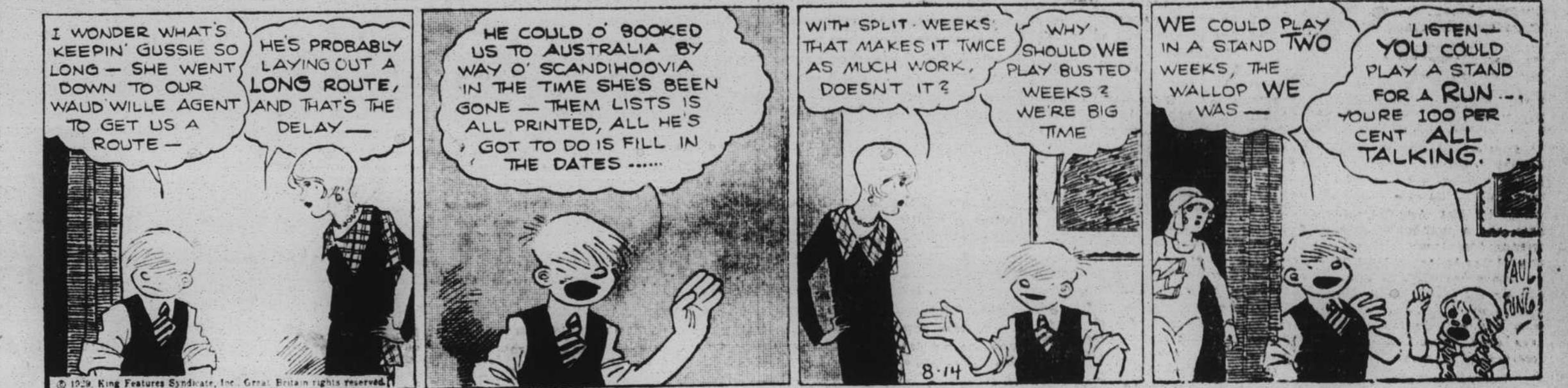

STUDY OF CRIME IS UNDERTAKEN BY COLLEGIANS

University Of Chicago And Northwestern Plan Criminal Research.

Chicago.—Criminals plying their trade in Chicago this fall, are due to bump against something new in detective work.

Both the University of Chicago and Northwestern university are preparing now to demonstrate what science can do when directed against crime. They are prepared to use the city as a laboratory, and at the moment are rounding out details of methods to be pursued.

In each instance scientific specialists are available to give the most modern touch to the research work. At the University of Chicago, Chief August Vollmer, of Berkeley, Cal.—long noted as the country's most scientific policeman—will be on hand October 1, to head the crime research department there.

Expert In Charge.
 At Northwestern university, Major Calvin Goddard, ballistics expert of renown, is to take charge of the research department, to operate

under a \$300,000 endowment provided by Chicago business men. He now is in Europe studying the more scientific methods of police in London, Berlin and Paris.

These departments, linking police work to the facilities of higher education were inspired by the St. Valentine's Day massacre here of seven Moran gangsters. The utility of ordinary police methods in seeking slayers of crimes of this type led to the engagement of Major Goddard in the hope that a study of the guns and bullets used in the killing might lead to identification of the killers. From this grew the idea of a general crime laboratory.

"Chicago and other American cities are far behind Europe in the scientific inquiry of clues," Major Goddard said before leaving on his present tour of investigation. "Murders have been solved by continental detectives through the running down of bacteria on dead men's clothing and through other detections equally as subtle. Also they are ahead of us in blood analysis, study of hand-writing, foot prints and other bits of evidence."

Facilities Available.
 At the University of Chicago, the crime research department is to have command of the university's scientific resources. The departments of physics, chemistry, medicine, psychiatry and anthropology are to cooperate, so that police will

have almost unlimited assistance.

The Northwestern Laboratory of Crime is to be primarily a place of investigation and will be located on the McKinlock campus near the downtown section.

Chief Vollmer, who is to head the University of Chicago's department, has long been recognized for his modern crime detection schemes. He gained fame with his lie detector, and was one of the first to stress the possibilities of ballistics—scientific study of firearms and projec-

tiles—in running down crimes. He was the first to adopt radio-equipped police cars. Likewise he considers it necessary to have scientifically trained coppers, and has made it a practice to enlist university students for his force.

Between the two universities, Chicago expects to provide some hot times for her criminals.

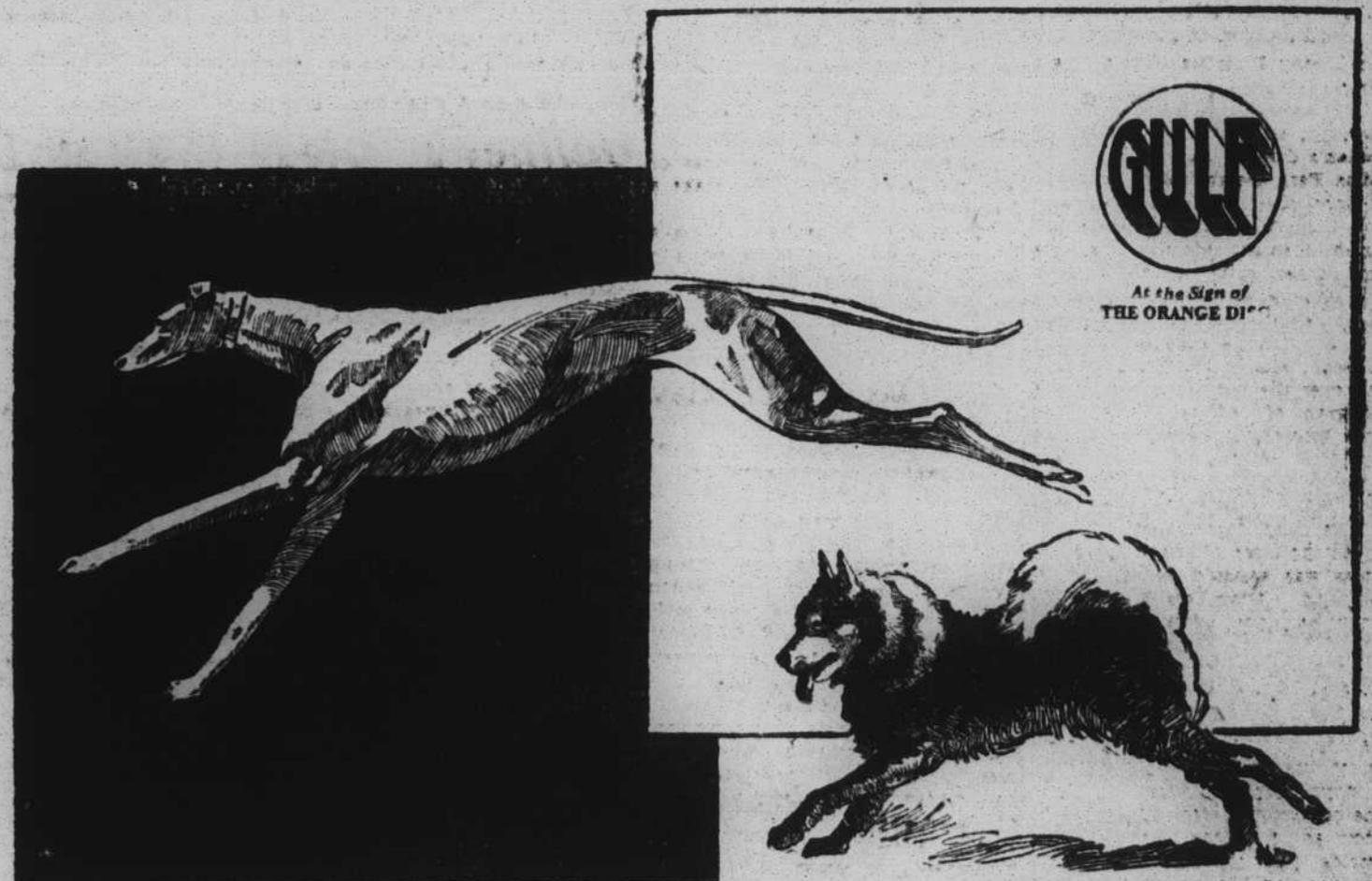
A preacher was explaining to his congregation the great unhappiness caused by divorce, and urged husbands to be more attentive to their wives, and kiss them more frequently.
