


To Deliver Unsealed **Telegrams During** Jewish Holidays

Unsealed telegrams will be delivered by the Western Union Telegraph company, during the celebration of Rosh Hashana, the Jewish New Year, which starts at sundown of October 4, according to an announcement made today by R. E. Blackwelder, manager of the Western Union office. This special service has been provided in order that Orthodox Hebrews may comply with a Mosaic law which prohibits their tearing anything during the holidays

The exceptionally large volume of greeting telegrams sent during the Jewish New Year celebration has induced the telegraph company to provide special facilities for their transmission this year, as in previous years. Not only will additional operators and messengers be assigned to offices in Jewish sections but special Jewish New Year blank and envelope which will be used for all number of suggested phrasings for these messages have been compiled for the convenience of patrons.




