### CORN STALK OVER 15 FEET TALL AT BLACK MOUNTAIN

Black Mountain.—Recently farmers of this vicinity indulged in a contest—one which was not planned ahead—to see who could put the best display in the offices of Mayor R. E. Finch. W. R. Goodson started the rivalry when he brought a 14-foot corn stalk to town as "the tallest ever." J. R. Padgett hurried to his cornfield and returned with one 13 feet, 3 inches tall and filled with ripe ears. J. R. Lance noticed the corn exhibit so he brought in two pumpkins and asked how many pies could be made from them and on weighing them it was found one was 61 pounds, and five feet in circumference, while the other was smaller—only 52 pounds.

Tryon, Oct. 12.—Polk county has combined the celebration of home coming week with a market day and both will take place at Harmer field, the Polk county playground on Saturday, Oct. 19. (American Legion in charge.) At ten o'clock it is planned to have flag raising ceremonies with the Boy Scouts and the sale of produce will begin. Farmers from all over the county bringing in their available supplies of potatoes, apples, eggs, butter, etc. Between 11 and 1 o'clock there are to be races for the young people, a pet show, horseshoe pitching, a style show, and a competition of choirs for the Weigel silver cup.

The charges were made jointly by the Rev. John Goben, former executive of the Temple who was discharged two days ago after a disagreement over policies; the Rev. H. E. Alford of Angelus temple, the Rev. Willard Pope of Pomona, who was dismissed last night, the Rev. R. L. Larson of Hollywood and the Rev. J. H. Stilton of El Monte. This action was followed by an announcement from the district attorney's office that it had received affidavits from a private detective stating that 45 minutes after Mrs. Lois Pantages, wife of the theatrical magnate, had been convicted of manslaughter last month a conference was held at the Pantages home in which the evangelist participated.
