Little Change In Cotton Price Likely For Year

This Fall Will Average Near That Of Last Year.

The price of cotton this fall mist at State college. If economic conditions improve in European prices may advance slightly but there is no evidence that conditions in the United States will be such as to warrant any large

Dr. Forster says that governmental reports show that production this year will be approximately fifteen million bales. The carry-over on July 31, 1929, is estimated to be 4.500,000 making a total supply for the year ending July 31, 1930, of approximately 19,500,000.

The world consumption of American cotton for the year ending July 31, 1929, was 15,076,000 bales and there is no reason why consumption for the season of 1929-30 will be any greater than this. Since consumption will probably equal production this year, there will not be a burdensome surplus of cotton. says Dr. Forster. In fact, the carryover next July should not exceed 4,600,000 bales.

Economic conditions in Europe and the United States materially affect the price of cotton and industrial conditions in Europe have been such recently that lower takings of cotton has resulted. Renewed activity is looked for in the British mills since the termination of the lockout on August 19. 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

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
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
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
