

#### Former County Man Prospects For Oil In Robeson County

E. R. Smith And Partner Lease Several Thousand Acres In Lumberton Section.

Lumberton, Nov. 12.-E. R. Smith

Born to Mr. and Mrs. Miller and G. Gillespie, of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., oil prospectors, the former once of Kings Mountain, have been in Robeson county for the past five or six weeks and have secured leases on several thousand acres of land in the vicinity of the Davis filling station, six miles from Lumberton, Raft Swamp township, where oil has been flowing from a Mr. and Mrs. Rex Phillips, and pump for the past several weeks. far away as six miles from the filling station, it is said. Finding oil at the pump at the

filling station brought to the minds of several of the people of the community facts that lead then to believe there has been trace of oil there for the past 30 years. For years people have been having trouble with their pumps out there, often getting a yellowish sort of substance that resembles the stuff that is being pumped out of the ground at the filling station. Recently many people have observed that some kind of oil has been on top of the small streams along Raft and Holy swamps. Some skeptical people have gone to the bottom of the streams and found leaves saturated with oil. Burns Well.

The oil that has been coming from the pump is of orange color. It has a peculiar odor, at first smells of linseed oil and then of refined kerosene. It burns with ease, and some of the people of the community have Born to Mr. and Mrs. Clifton oil found in the streams and holes
