
## Blazing Trail on Bottom of World



Carrying the Stars and Stripes to the bottom of the world by air, as he has already carried them to the top, Commander Richard E. Byrd set out on Thanksgiving Day in his successful flight across the South Pole. The daring explorer and his crew used the tri-motored airplane Floyd Bennett, named after Byrd's companion on the famous North Pole flight in 1926.
