Journal of Commerce Memphis says owners holding better grades but show more disposition to sell lower grades, basis averages higher, sales at 10 southern markets for past week 168,000 against 190,000 previous week 157,000 last year and 107,000 year before, domestic and foreign spinners show little disposition to buy. Charlotte Special says one mill bought 20,000 bales off grades this week, sheeting and 1 print cloth mills running four day week. Probably higher today on cables if offerings from south are no heavier than yesterday.—Cleveland.
