

Polkville Defeated By Lattimore Five

Score Was One Sided, 62 To 20. Weathers Shoots 31 Points. Lee A Star.

Lattimore, Dec. 19.—The strong Lattimore town team met and subdued a strong team of all-stars from Polkville here Wednesday night by the one-sided score of 62-20. The Polkville boys put up a good fight, but the opposition was too much for the outcome to ever be in doubt. The goal shooting of "Cricket" Weathers was the feature of the game. He has played great ball in all the former games of the season; but in this game he mounted to almost unbelievable heights. He was all over the floor and his shots were made with deadly accuracy. He left a sufficient proof of the above statement, for he piled up just a mere total of 31 points, 13 of which he scored in one quarter. His ability to find the basket is steadily improving, and this promises to be by far a greater season than he has ever experienced before. Such a brilliant performance as he put up in this battle would be poison to any high school or amateur team. Although his work was of a most excellent type, he was by no means all the show. The few fans who were out to witness the game were mad to recall the games of old, for he had as his running mate at the other forward post his brother, Paris. Paris rung up 23 points, a rather remarkable total for a single game.

The Polkville boys were seldom able to break through the defense of the locals as long as the starting line-up remained in the game. They launched a rather effective attack in the last quarter, after the locals ran in their subs; but it was of no avail, for the lead they had to overcome was too great. Lee was the outstanding performer for the visitors with 15 points.

STATE MUSEUM IS BEING URGED

Plan Has Backing Of N. C. Art Society; To Seek Legislative Act.

Raleigh—The North Carolina State Art Society, at its recent annual meeting in Raleigh, passed resolutions directing the board of directors of the society to take steps to secure a site in Raleigh for the location of a state museum and that the next general assembly be asked to provide a fund for the construction of such a building. If the legislature will not appropriate funds for the erection of a museum, the resolution added, it should be requested to appropriate half the sum necessary for such a building with the condition that the other half be provided by private gifts.

The general assembly would also be asked, under another resolution, to appropriate a fund for the purpose of purchasing inexpensive reproductions of famous works of art for the public schools of North Carolina with the condition that certain minimum amounts be duplicated locally and that the selections be made under recommendations and plans of the State Department of public instruction.

Another resolution called upon the state to avail itself of any Federal aid that is available to the state or its agencies for highway beautification.

A resolution of appreciation of the society for the works of art bequeathed it in the will of the late Robert Fullenwider Phifer as well as one of thanks to half a dozen persons who made individual gifts to the society was also passed.
