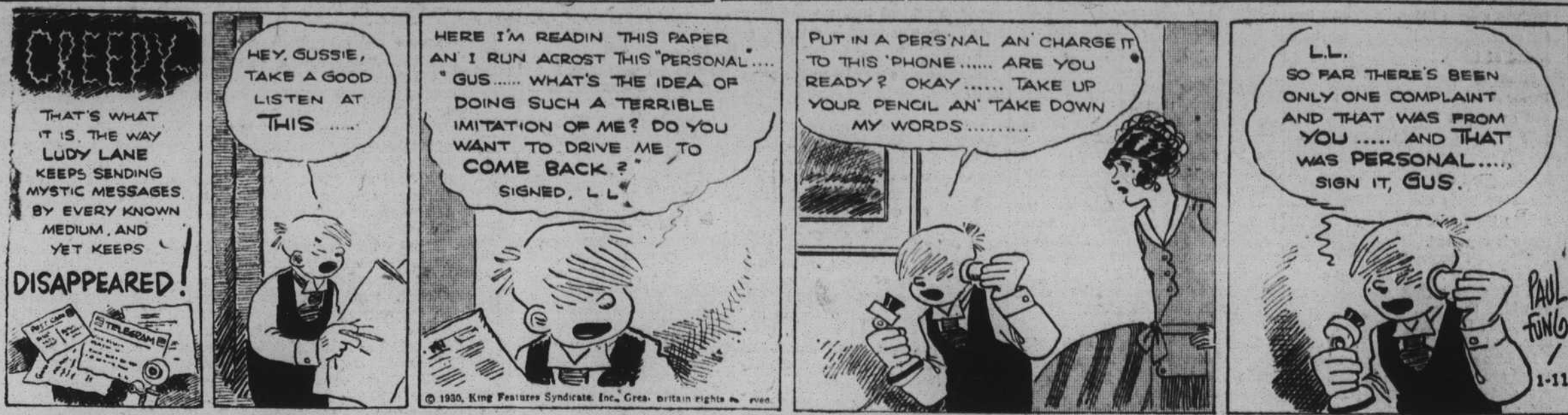

High School Debating Query For Year Given
Average Institution So Inefficient That Authorities Should Be Indicted, Says

Boston—Such is the inefficiency with which American high schools are administered, even with the highly vaunted modern techniques, that "state's attorneys in most commendable indictments against educational authorities for malfeasance and misappropriation of public funds."

This broadside was launched at Harvard university by Prof. Thomas H. Briggs of Teachers' college, Columbia university, regarded as the country's leading authority on secondary education, in the annual Inglis memorial lecture which he was invited to give. Dr. Briggs emphasized that he was not speaking for either Teachers' college or Harvard, but as a private individual.

Education as an investment, he asserted, has failed to pay dividends. The taxpayer has been shamefully imposed upon by school officials and school boards which fail to show results for huge expenditures of public money. After four years of work, high school graduates have neither culture nor preparation for life. Sticking close to the antiquated, traditional curriculum, educators wastefully attempt to make academic scholars of all.
