## Opening Of Biltmore House Will Reveal World Renowned Gardens

(Special to The Star.)  
Asheville, Feb. 24.—Rivaling the famed Magnolia gardens in beauty, and offering to the beholder a continuous succession of colorful masses of flowers, through the spring, summer and autumnal months, the gardens of Biltmore House will be one of the popular points of interest for visitors in Asheville this year. The gardens and the mansion itself will be opened to visitors on and after March 15.

Vast sums of money were expended by the late George W. Vanderbilt both in the construction of Biltmore House and in the beautifying of its interior and the grounds which surround it. The mansion covering over four acres of ground and containing in its huge rooms, many priceless art treasures will be a center of attraction. The gardens are also expected to attract much attention.

Over 300 acres of land in the vicinity of Biltmore Mansion have been landscaped and many acres surrounding the house have been intensively cultivated for floral beauty. The gardens include sections designed on the Italian style, an area devoted to shrubbery, a wall rose garden, green house, a garden devoted to herbaceous plants, a tea garden and a seemingly endless maze of attractive walks.

Lillies of a myriad varieties will be displayed during the summer months in the large pools of the Italian section. Shrubs bloom through out the spring and summer in the areas devoted to them and along the walks through the grounds. The rose gardens are particularly notable for the large number of varieties.

During May and June the grounds present a gorgeous display with the bloom of the rhododendron, mountain laurel and azalea. Many rare varieties of plants were collected from all parts of the world when the gardens were first established and today the grounds of the mansion are of interest to botanists as well as to lovers of floral beauty.
