

It is a far cry back to 1790, when the Federal census of the United States was taken. The Census Bureau has, like all other things, improved its system since the first census taking. Above illustration shows the extreme care which Uncle Sam takes in gathering and compiling data on his gigantic family. An interesting comparison in the illustration is that of the census taken in Boston

in 1790 with its antiquated forms compared with the more practical form of 1930. Note the important names listed in the Boston census report, names of persons who played a part in the history of our country which have earned for them a place on history's pages. The compilation of the 1930 census will require the services of more than 100,000 people.
