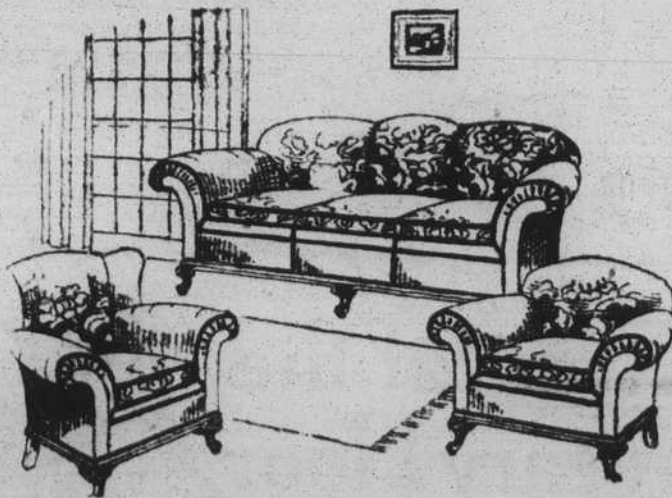

"Reaching All the People" Will be Subject for Discussion by Baptists.

All pastors, superintendents and other Sunday school workers of the Kings Mountain Baptist Sunday School association, and all other persons interested in reaching more people for our Sunday schools, are urged to attend the May meeting of the association at Beaver Dam church Sunday at 2:30 p. m. This church is situated on highway 20 about four miles west of Shelby and is easily accessible to all churches. "Reaching all the People," the topic for discussion is one of the most important confronting our people at this time. Five of the most effectual workers in the association will discuss the subject and an open conference will follow in which all may participate.

Recently compiled data show that a majority of all the people of the association territory are either Baptist inclined. This disclosure reveals the fact of a great Baptist task. Further disclosures show that of the 20,000 possibilities for Baptist Sunday schools only around half of them are enrolled in our schools and only about six thousand in regular attendance. Our workers in all the churches will observe that the larger number is yet outside our schools. The multitudes are yet to be reached.

Let all workers and others interested in reaching more of the people attend the meeting Sunday afternoon and hear the matter discussed by those who are making special preparation for the discussion, and then be ready to join in the roundtable to follow.
