The time for filing tax returns for the year 1930 has been extended to Saturday, May 10.

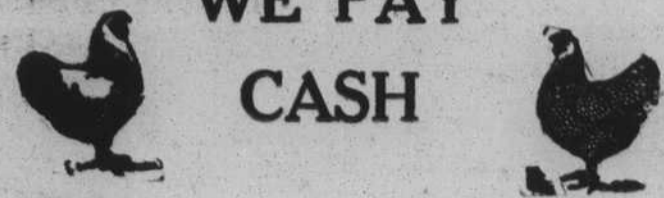
Any and all tax payers not listed by that time will be subject to the penalty of 25% addition as provided for in the Consolidated Statutes, sec. 7971.
