**He Keeps Solemn 65-Year-Old Tryst Alone**



Pleasant Marion Keeble, 84-year-old veteran of the Civil War, journeyed the distance of eight miles to Rockford, Tenn., to keep a promise made 65 years ago with Civil War buddies, all of whom are now dead. When the Sultana, prison ship, sank near Memphis in the Mississippi River, April 21, 1865, the Tennessee Federal soldiers who were saved in the disaster, which cost 1,328 lives, decided to hold an annual reunion. The 84-year-old veteran is now the sole survivor.

**To Die For Attack On Sweetheart And Then Murdering Her**

James Spivey Sentences Affirmed For Slaying His Sweetheart In Lee County.

Raleigh.—The supreme court refused a new trial in a capital case for the seventh time during the spring term when it found no error in the sentence that James Spivey of Lee county be electrocuted for the murder of Betty Spivey, to whom he proposed marriage.

The supreme court has granted two new trials this term to persons sentenced to death and the nine capital cases it has considered is believed to be a record for one term. Betty Spivey was killed with an axe on the night of September 21, 1929 in a cow barn shortly after James Spivey, who was calling on her and she had left the house thinking that some one was attempting to steal a cow.

Evidence was submitted that the girl a few minutes before had shown her caller a pair of hose the court opinion said, which she "teasingly told James Spivey had been given to her by another fellow." The coroner testified that the girl had been criminally attacked. Spivey did not take the stand during his trial.

His electrocution date was automatically set for May 23.
