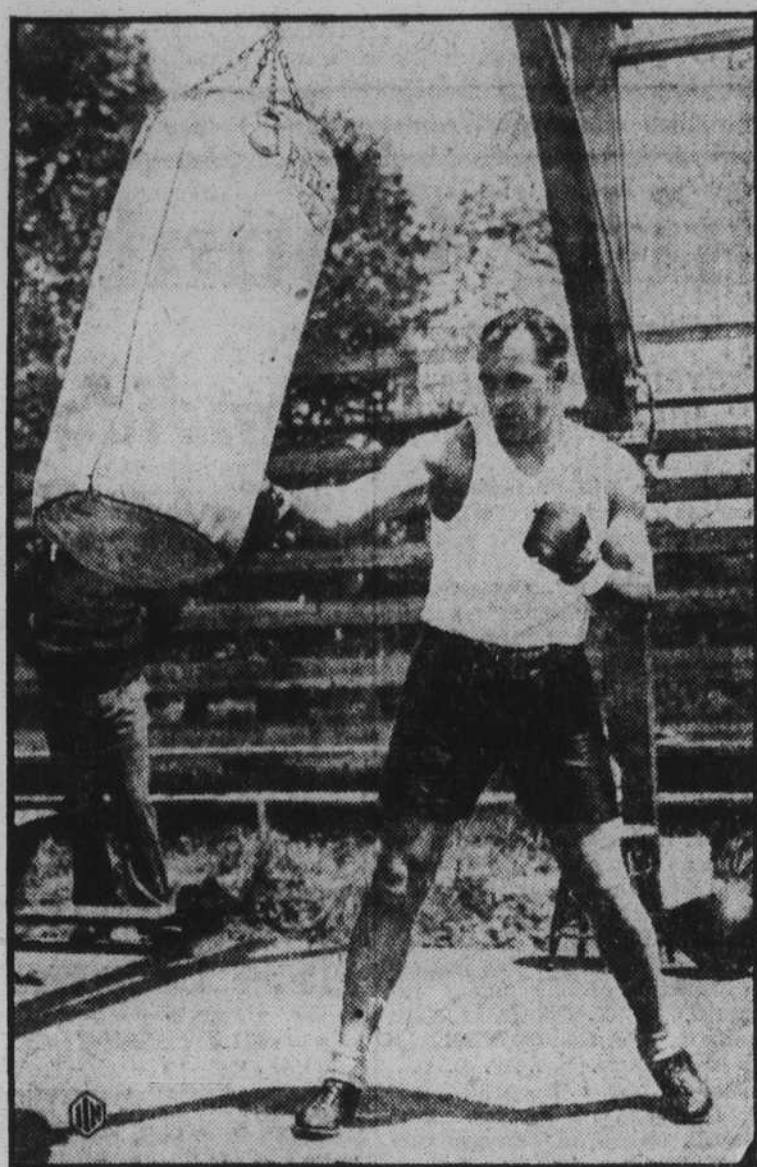

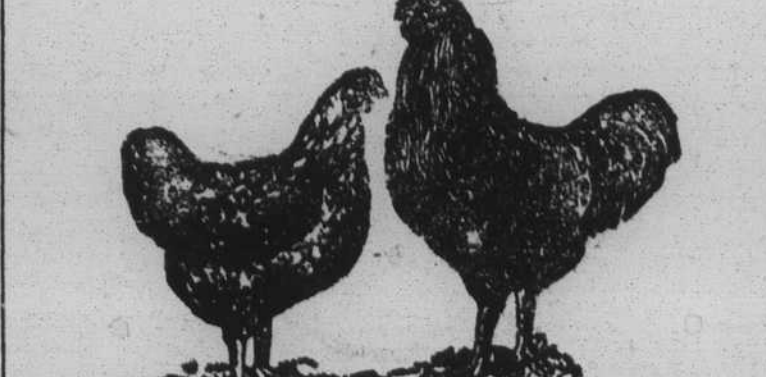
Sail to Victory in Keystone
