## VOTE FOR Hamilton C. Jones For Congress

IN THE PRIMARY ON SATURDAY, JULY 5TH

On Saturday, July 5th, the Democrats of the Ninth District will nominate a candidate for Congress. Everyone will agree that the district ought to nominate a man who can be elected in November. In fact, Major Bulwinkle ran behind the ticket in every county in the district, including his home county of Gaston, except the county of Madison; and was beaten by Jones in his own county by 186 votes.

WAS AL SMITH TO BLAME? Governor Gardner and the other state officers supported Governor Smith for president, as did Major Bulwinkle. By nominating Hamilton C. Jones as its standard bearer, the Democracy of the Ninth District will present an opponent to Republican Jones who has never been beaten by him. It will present a man who is absolutely invulnerable, who is impervious to attack, and who will harmonize every faction and interest allied with the Democratic party. Two more years of Republican Congressman Jones, who is also Republican National Committeeman, with his ability to bring Republican influence and money into the district would be a constant threat to the Democratic party in every county in the district.
