20,000 Jobless Rake Off New York Snow

Idle Men Rejoice As They Are Given Opportunity To Earn Five Dollars A Day.

New York, Feb. 9.—Snow shovels clanged a metallic paean of praise to the weather today as 20,000 New Yorkers rejoiced that they had jobs at last.

A week-end snowfall which in other years would have been unwelcome was greeted by city officials as a splendid chance to help the jobless. The 20,000 were put to work at \$5 a day.

From the canyons of Manhattan to the farthest open spaces of Queens they labored joyfully. Many of them were too thinly clad, officials said, but shivering or not, all seemed cheerful at the chance to earn a half dollar an hour.

They had been summoned to the job by radio and by recruiting officials who made the rounds of employment bureaus and "flophouses."

Four Million Church Is Formally Opened

John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Among 2,400 Present When Church Is Dedicated.

New York, Feb. 9.—The non-sectarian Riverside church, pulpit of the Rev. Harry Emerson Fosdick and place of worship of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and his family, was dedicated Sunday with warning by its pastor that civilization cannot be sustained without the message which the church of God is trying to convey.

A congregation of 2,400 persons filled the auditorium and galleries of the \$4,000,000 gothic edifice high above the Hudson beside Grant's tomb, and hundreds more heard the services by amplifiers in other rooms of the church or stood outside on the snowy Riverside Drive hoping in vain to enter.

Among the 2,400 was Mr. Rockefeller, Jr., whose beneficence helped largely to build the church.

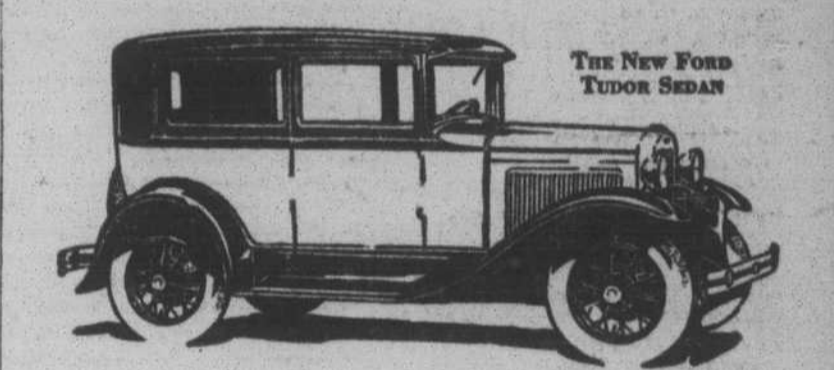
