## Distinguished Ky. Man Is A Visitor

General Garnett of Distinguished Ancestry, Visitor in Shelby Recently.

Except under deliberate and unwarranted provocation, I try to never write anything of individuals nor different regions that will cause somebody to feel the iron in his soul of abuse and indignation. Some people in their perpetration of alleged jokes take very particular pains to direct coarse and stinging insults to their fulminations.

I have been sick for last three weeks, and therefore unable to visit Shelby or elsewhere. While languishing in suffering, a very able and distinguished friend from Louisville, Ky., visited Shelby, incidentally, while on his way to Charlotte, and called for me. He made the mistake of thinking I lived near Shelby because I am located on K-5, Shelby, that I live near the town.

As a fact, my home is distant about 15 miles. This distinguished visitor was late attorney general of Kentucky; and a very able and eminent lawyer by both practice and heredity. His late father, James Garnett, sr., was an able lawyer and a distinguished jurist—and James Garnett, jr., ran true to form. Both were sober, religious men and uncompromising foes of John Barlycorn; both useful and consistent members of the Baptist church; and James Garnett jr., enjoys the distinction of being past grand master of Masonry of the fraternity in Kentucky. I claim and esteem him as a life-long friend; and deplore the fact that I could not meet him on this visit. I am under the impression that he came here largely to see our magnificent highways; for he has organized a crusade for good roads in that martial commonwealth.

In about sixty counties Kentucky has most excellent shell roads; while in the mountain and wire-grass region they are execrable. From what I know about General James Garnett, he is about the most influential citizen in Kentucky. He wrote me a letter from Shelby from the office of Sheriff I. M. Allen, in which he spoke very highly of Shelby, our magnificent highways, the expert farming indications, the school buildings and the fine, stalwart type of citizenship. Among other endowments, he is a thrilling and convincing orator.

While a prominent citizen now of Louisville, he is a native of Adair county, Kentucky, which is my birthplace. This county has furnished three congressmen, three governors, two attorney generals; and one chief justice. Rollin Hurt, a

neighbor and classmate of mine at Columbia M. and F. high school was chief justice; and James Gartett Parker Watkins Hardin have been honored as attorney general and each are gifted orators.

So the people who imagine that I never saw a house with glass windows or a brick chimney can modify their views.

Permit me to say in this connection that General Garnett and I have discussed the subject of road construction and I told him we have as good roads as exist in the Union.
