Casear, June 8.—Our community was made sad upon hearing of the death of Mrs. Eliza Parker, who died June 3, and was buried the following day at Mt. Zion Baptist church. Her pastor, Rev. Otis Cook, conducted the services.

Mrs. Parker lacked six days of being 77 years of age. She was a daughter of the late Tifford Price and one of the prominent men of upper Cleveland in his day. She was the last of her father's family to die. More than 50 years ago she married Geo. W. Parker, who with one daughter, Mrs. John White, survives.

Until about a year ago when her health failed, Mrs. Parker was an unusually active person for her age, taking great interest in the welfare of the community and ever ready to lend a helping hand. She will be greatly missed by all.
