Mr. Morrow advises planting snap beans every three weeks in order to keep a full supply of fresh, tender snaps. Protection from the bean beetle may be secured by spraying or dusting with magnesium arsenate as soon as adult beetles are found.

To keep leaf blight under control, Mr. Morrow says to spray the cantaloupe, cucumber and watermelon crops with Bordeaux mixture. Two or three applications will give reasonable control.


