Schmelling Gets A Great Welcome

Speakers Hall Herr Max and 8,000 Greet Fighter On Arrival At Berlin.

Berlin, July 14.—Nothing was left undone in the way of speeches and ceremony today to assure Max Schmelling that he was really welcome home as Germany's hero. The heavyweight champion landed at Tempelhofer Airfield from Bremen. A crowd of 8,000, unusual for such an occasion, turned out to greet the conqueror of Bill Stribling.

Handkerchiefs waved wildly as the plane was sighted and the crowd greeted Schmelling with a volley of "Hoehs" as the champion jumped out of the plane and ran into the arms of his mother who was waiting to greet him. Leading sports officials made speeches, paying tribute to the prize fighter as "a credit to the Fatherland," "master of all categories," "shining example of German sportsmanship."

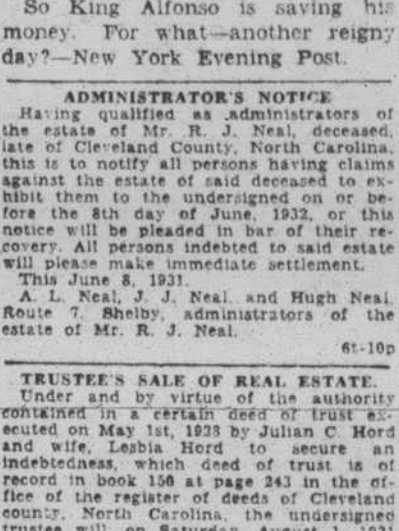
