Chicago.—The belief that a man's criminal tendencies sometimes can be cured by taking out his appendix was expressed by Dr. W. A. Guild, of Chicago, a member of the Wickersham sub-committee on law enforcement.

Speaking before the American Association of Official Surgeons he said: "A man, intelligent and well edu-

cated was continually short in his books while working for various merchandise stores. While he was in jail I removed his appendix. Now he is manager of a large chain store in Chicago.

"A forger was in jail for his fourth offense. When he got out he saw a Salvation army band. So he stepped into a cigar store, forged a check for \$5, cashed it and placed the money on the drum. I removed his 'grapevine appendix' and he was cured of forging checks."

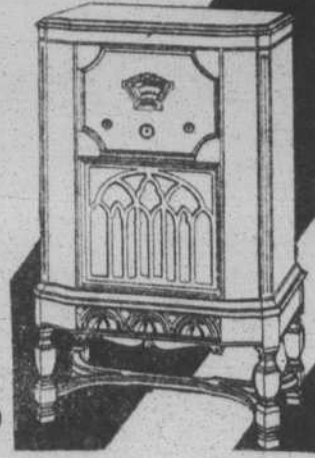
