## Aviation the High Road to Glory But Fame Pays Small Dividends

Few of the Great Air Feats That Thrilled the World Have Brought Worthwhile Financial Returns to Famous Fliers. Veterans Ask Does Glory Pay?



With the conquest of the Pacific by Herndon and Pangborn, few more fields are left to conquer by air-men who travel the sky route to fame. And they bemoan the fact. But the old-timers at the game look at the struggle for glory from a different angle. They say that fame won in the clouds does not pay and they point out cases to prove it. It is true that Lindbergh's dash to Paris netted him an amount estimated at from \$300,000 to \$1,000,000, although he refused to commercialize the feat. And Ad-Clarence Chamberlain, who flew from New York to Germany, did not profit much financially, nor did Holger Høiis, who flew to Copenhagen. Holger is now barnstorming for a living. Although the Post and Gatty flight around the world in eight and one-half days was acclaimed as the greatest feat in the history of aviation, the daring fliers did not receive any considerable dividends from the fame it brought them. The same is true of the Pangborn-Herdon flight across the Pacific. Although they won a prize of \$25,000, offered by a Japanese newspaper for the flight, they lost two more prizes of the same amount each because they did not fulfill the required terms. The conquerors of the Pacific are actually in the red for \$20,000, it is reported.

### Fall Best Time To Apply Lime

While crop rotations will modify to some extent the time of applying limestone to soils, usually best results are secured when this material is applied in the fall or early winter on plowed land. "Farm roads are in better condition in the fall and the operator can get out over his fields easier than he can when the land is wet and muddy in the spring," says C. B. Williams, head of the department of agronomy at State college. "Much of the rush of farm work will also be over after the crops are harvested. Lime applied at this season on plowed land will be thoroughly mixed with the soil by the action of rains, snow and freezes and being thus incorporated into the soil, the lime will satisfy the needs of the soil before another crop is seeded in the spring."

Mr. Williams says the crops that usually will respond to liming and receive the greatest benefits are red, crimson and alsike clovers, alfalfa, lespedeza, cowpeas, soybeans and hairy vetch. The yields of cotton, corn and small grains will also be materially increased by the use of lime when these crops are grown in rotations where suitable legumes are included. If part of these legumes are plowed under the use of limestone will be more profitable. Mr. Williams finds that one to one and one-half tons of ground limestone or its equivalent per acre applied broadcast will usually be sufficient. The use of such small amounts applied more frequently is more desirable than making extremely heavy applications at long intervals, according to field demonstrations reported by county agents of the extension service.
