### Diagnostic Center Wing Is Completed

Washington, D. C.—Construction of the new wing at the Diagnostic Center of the Veterans' Administration here, commonly known as Mt. Alto hospital, has been completed and the new facilities are now being occupied. The new wing comprises space for a new administration building and nearly 100 additional beds, of which sixty-five will be available for women veterans. The building formerly used for administrative purposes will be converted into wards for eye, ear, nose and throat cases, and the general rearrangement of space will provide enlarged facilities for the handling of surgical patients. Among other facilities, the new construction includes an operating room with an amphitheatre to accommodate forty or fifty spectators. From time to time certain groups of Veterans' Administration physicians are detailed to the Diagnostic center for post graduate courses of instruction, and special facilities will be provided to increase the effectiveness of this form of medical training.

### Charlotte Seeks Dinner Of Young Tarheel Leaders

Ask Young Democrats to Gather There. Plan Winter Relief.

(Star News Bureau.) Raleigh, Oct. 28.—Charlotte is making a strong bid—and with fair chances of success—for the second annual Jackson day dinner, plans for which are getting under way, according to Tyre Taylor, chairman of the North Carolina Young People's Democratic organization, under whose auspices the dinner is held. While plans are immature, it is expected to have several national figures, such as Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, of New York; Newton D. Baker and Owen D. Young, prospective candidates for President, as chief speaker, while other leading Democrats of this and other states may be on the program. J. J. Shouse of the National Democratic executive committee, was principal speaker at the first meeting, nearly two years ago in Raleigh at which leading political figures of the state were present. Charlotte is probably the only city with a building, its Armory-Auditorium, with sufficient space for the dinner, since the Raleigh auditorium was burned, and, according to Mr. Taylor, has a good chance of being the host city. The date has not been decided, but the dinner will probably be in January or March. The dinner was omitted this year because of the long legislative session.
