## Roosevelt Pluck Made Him Figure In U. S. Politics

**N. Y. Governor Conquered Shattered Body To Emerge A Presidential Possibility.**

Washington.—If there ever was a "happy warrior" in American politics, Franklin D. Roosevelt of New York by the greatest majority any Democrat ever rolled up for the office, is the man.

Every picture of Franklin Roosevelt that has flashed on the screen of each Democratic national convention for the last two decades tells the story of the man's unflinching enthusiasm.

**Back 74 Years Ago, A Gloomy Period On In This County**

It is a gloomy moment in history. Not for many years—not in the lifetime of most men who read this paper—has there been so much grave and deep apprehension; never has the future seemed so incalculable as this time. In our own

country there is universal commercial prostration and panic, and thousands of our poorest fellow citizens are turned out against the approaching winter without employment, and without the prospect of it.

In France, the political cauldron seethes and bubbles with uncertainty; Russia hangs, as usual, like a cloud, dark and silent upon the horizon of Europe; while all the energies, resources and influences of the British Empire are sorely tried, and are yet to be tried more sorely, in coping with the vast and deadly Indian insurrection, and with its disturbed relations in China.

It is a solemn moment, and no man can feel an indifference, (which, happily, no man pretends to feel) in the issue of events.

Of our own troubles no man can see the end. They are, fortunately, as yet mainly commercial; and if we are only to lose money, and by painful poverty to be taught wisdom—the wisdom of honor, of faith, of sympathy and of charity—no man need seriously to despair.

Good friends—let our conduct prove that the call comes to men who have large hearts, however narrowed their homes may be; who have open hands, however empty their purses. In time of peril we have nothing but manhood, strong in its faith in God, to rely upon; and whoever shows himself truly a God-fearing man now by helping wherever and however he can, will

be as blessed and beloved as a great light in darkness.

The foregoing summary of world economic conditions was not written yesterday, nor last week, nor last year. It was written 74 years ago by the editor of Harper's Weekly and appeared on Oct. 10, 1857, in that publication, then one of the ablest edited journals of America.

It reveals graphically that history, so far as business depressions are concerned, has a habit of repeating itself. It reveals that our forefathers were compelled to tackle a world-wide economic slump almost identically like the one of today.

The prophets are now predicting the usual unusually cold winter, basing it on early appearance of the birds, flying south, heavy coats of fur on captured animals and other natural signs.

Another four years and Franklin Roosevelt walked, with a cane and a hand on his tall young son's shoulder, into the convention at Houston to nominate Smith for the third time and to lay the foundations of events that have made him twice governor of New York.

Even should he become a presidential nominee or one day enter the White House as president, probably there will never be for him the thrill there was in that moment when he walked into the Houston convention without crutches.

He was back in that moment in the game that has for him the greatest zest—the game of politics.

Roosevelt at Houston described Smith as the "happy warrior" of politics. Yet probably as much as any public man in his generation, he has earned that title himself.
