State To Share Big Federal Road Fund

Raleigh, Nov. 7.—North Carolina's net share of the federal aid road funds that have been apportioned by the secretary of agriculture is \$2,530,007, according to word received last week at the state highway commission.

This sum is available for immediate use on projected construction when matched by state funds. The apportionment for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1933, was made two and a half months earlier than usual in order that the states might get an early start on plans for next season's construction.

Paragon Buys Stock Asheville Furniture

The Paragon Furniture company has purchased the large bankrupt stocks of the Donald and Donald furniture store in Asheville, to include in their auction sales already being held at the Paragon Bazaar in place on West Warren street. The Asheville stock, with assets totalling some \$21,000, according to Mal Spangler, manager of the Paragon, has already been moved from the Asheville store to the building formerly occupied by the Chrysler agency on West Warren, where it is on display before each auction sale.

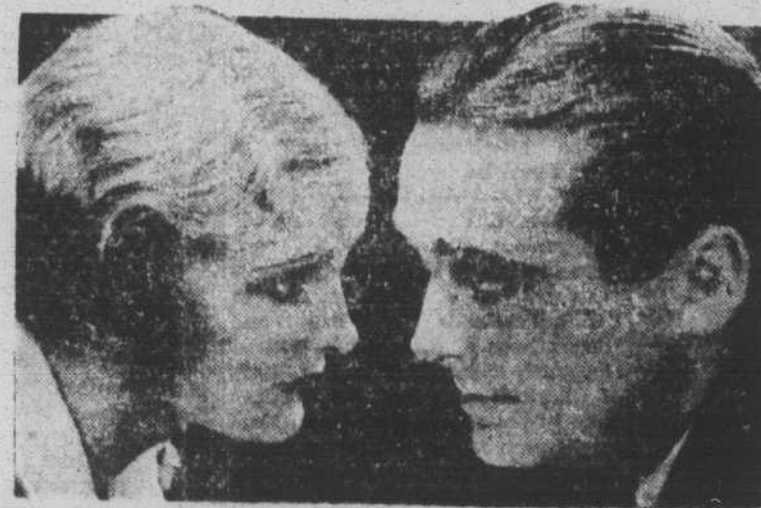
