## Woodmen Officials Launch Drive Here

Two Officials Address Woodmen Members. Women Are Accepted Now Into Lodge.

An enthusiastic meeting of Shelby camp, Modern Woodmen of America, was held Wednesday night when State Deputy J. A. Doubles of Greensboro and National Lecturer Thos H. Duffy of Dubuque, Iowa, addressed the members, their families and friends. The meeting was presided over by Dist. Deputy J. C. Tibbs of Asheville. Notwithstanding the inclement weather, a large gathering was on hand, including visiting members from Asheville, Old Fort, Morganton and Forest City.

State Deputy Doubles informed the camp that splendid progress is being made throughout the state in the growth of the society and urged the local members to cooperate in building the membership of the local camp. Several reels of motion pictures were shown in which the various activities and advantages of membership in the society were emphasized after which National Lecturer Duffy spoke eloquently on the merits of the society. Modern Woodmen of America recently revised its by-laws to admit women to membership and during the course of his address the national lecturer stressed the importance of the part now taken by women in the affairs of our country.

A membership campaign was inaugurated to add 50 new members to the camp during the remainder of this year, which will be in charge of F. L. Ellis, G. A. Eades and T. M. Lee.

The two Rockefeller recently gave the fund \$1,000,000. The \$250,000 gift is conditional upon the raising of \$5,000,000 above \$11,000,000 before July 1, 1932, \$50,000 to be paid for each million from other sources.

The committee announced it has raised \$1,710,003 for the relief of unemployment in New York this winter. The original goal of \$12,000,000 has been raised to \$16,000,000.
