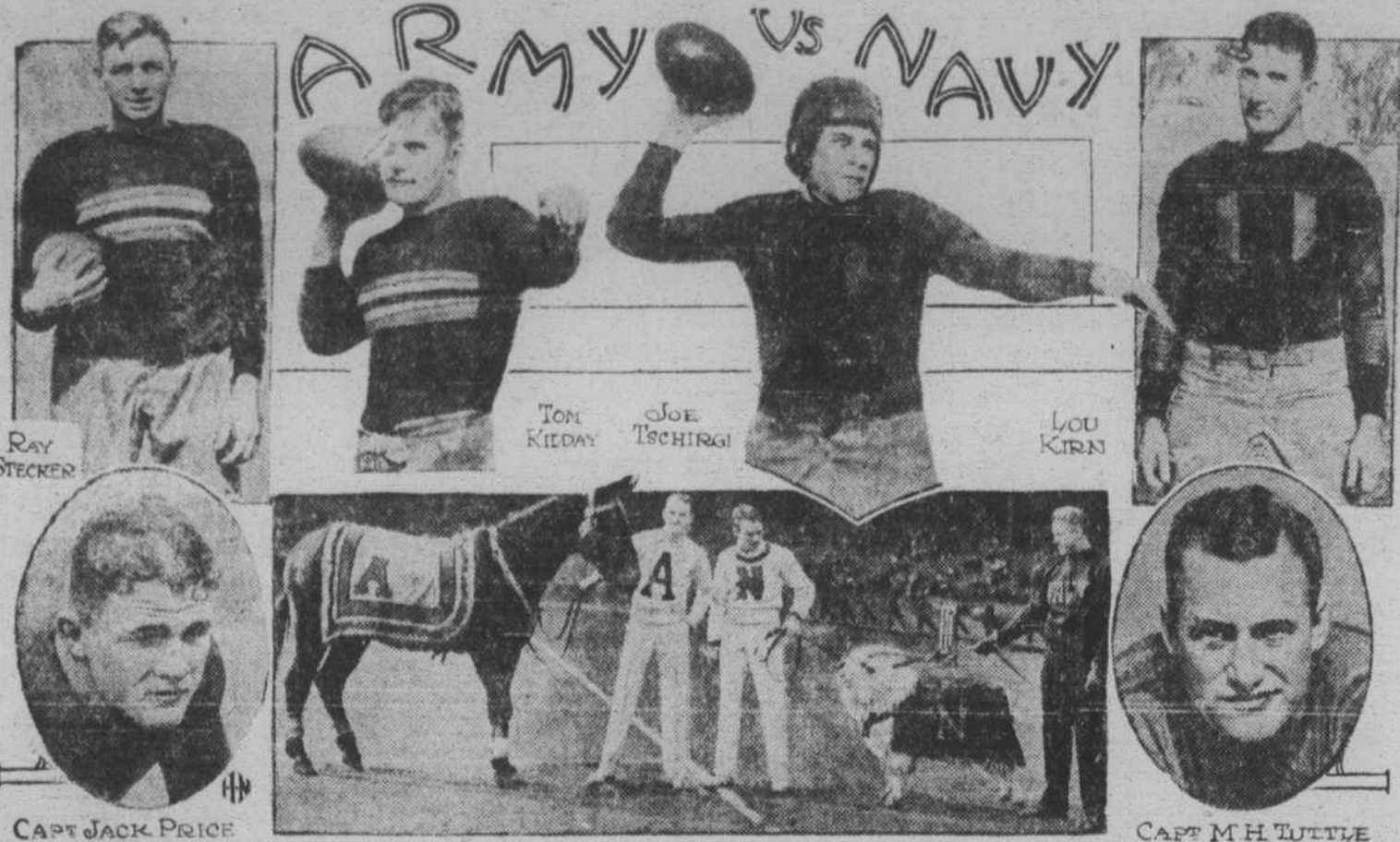


Stars to Shine in Army-Navy Charity Duel



Another Grid Game-And One Nearby Shelby

Good news for the football fans of Shelby and section—the grid season isn't over yet!

Although the college elevens have completed their season, with the exception of a few big holiday contests, one more interesting battle is to be played nearby Shelby.

It is the game Friday of this week, the 11th, between the Gaffney high, South Carolina champions, and the famous Tech high outfit from Atlanta. It will be played at Gaffney and starts at 2 o'clock.

Title Game.

Tech high is one of the two teams that defeated Charlotte. Western North Carolina champions this year; Gaffney high, with two or three more Clarys on the squad, hasn't been licked in several years. Charlotte would not play Gaffney and then Gaffney challenged the Atlanta eleven, conqueror of Charlotte for a game. Tech High accepted, and the game will come very near deciding the unofficial high school championship of Dixie.

Many Shelby fans, craving one more glimpse of football for this year, are planning to take in the contest.

The game should display some ball carrying almost as flashy as a college contest. About Gaffney it is said that W. The brilliant offense of the two elevens, ranked among the best high school teams ever produced in the South, promises to draw a record crowd for a high school tilt in the Carolinas.

Both Boys and Girls to Play Shelby Outfits in Tin Can.

A basketball rivalry of long standing will be renewed here Friday night when two Kings Mountain cage teams come to Shelby to meet the Shelby III boys and girls teams in the local tin can.

Victorious in their games so far this year, the Morris-Falls teams are expecting their hardest contests of the early season Friday night.

The Kings Mountain quint may upset the rebuilt Shelby five, on which there are only two veterans, and the Kings Mountain sextet has on it a couple of girls ranked among the best feminine shots in the state last year.

Tuesday night of next week two teams from Lincolnton will come here to play Shelby's cage outfits. All the double bill games start promptly at 7:30.

On Thursday night, the 17th, the strong Ellenboro quint will play Shelby here. There will be no girls game that night. The Ellenboro cagers are coached this year by Hood, former Lenoir-Rhyne star, who for several years put out quint at Lenoir that gave Shelby fits in the county championship tournaments.

Boys Beat No. 3, 20 To 10. Shelby Girls Win 15 To 13.

Shelby high cagers won their second double-header of the season here last night. The Shelby boys quint defeated the No. 3 consolidated school five 20 to 10, while the Shelby girls won from the No. 3 girls 15 to 13.

Jolley, Shelby center, led the scoring for the boys with nine points. Brown, at guard, looped in six points. Green and Wall with four points each led for No. 3.

In the girls game Nash, of No. 3, led the scoring with 11 of her team's 13 points. Mary Poston and Sara Louise Falls scored seven points each for Shelby.

I shall be pleased to hear from you. If you know Babe Carr and Tom McCarver, or any other fighters there I will also appreciate your mentioning to them that J. T. Harrell, care the Gazette, would like to hear from them in regard to getting them on the cards here, which are going good at this time.
