Miss King Gives Party.

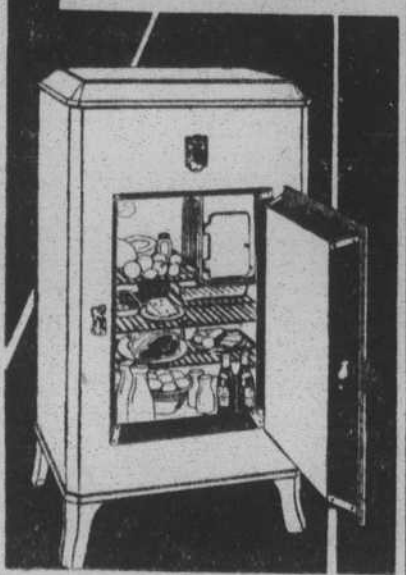
