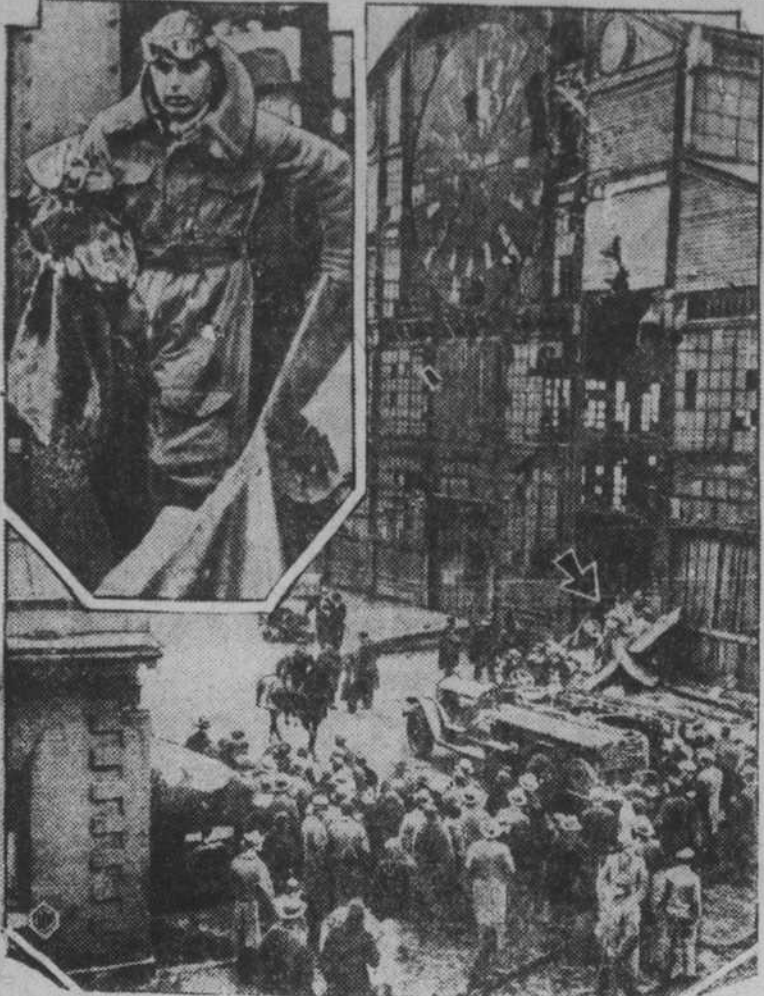


Pilot and Mail Safe in Crash
