## Rare Deep Sea Fish Is Caught

Miami, Fla.—A 4,000-pound whale-shark, rare deep sea fish of the kind many scientists contend must have swallowed Jonah, has been harpooned and towed to dock here.

The big fish was caught in the gulf stream off Miami by a fishing party headed by Captain Tommy Gifford. Fisherman said they knew of but three recorded catches of whale-shark in South Florida waters.

None were mounted but this one will be, its captors said, at a cost of approximately \$2,000. The bureau of fisheries at Washington and American Museum of Natural History at New York were notified of the catch brought in here.

Scientifically, the fish is known as Rhinodon-Typhus. It has a slate body with white spots and authorities say it is the only variety with a mouth big enough to swallow a man at one gulp.

## Hoover Not Worth Million Dollars Now

President Is Said To Have Made Lots Of Money But Has Gotten It Away.

Washington.—President Hoover's private fortune was estimated at less than a million dollars in the house by Representative Wood of Indiana, the chairman of the Republican national congressional committee.

Wood is ranking Republican member of the house appropriations committee. He opened the debate on the agriculture department's \$175,000,000 supply bill for the next fiscal year with a demand for a reduction in salaries of government employes.

Asked by Representative Shannon Democrat, Missouri, whether President Hoover would approve a reduction in his salary and what

was the extent of the chief executive's private fortune, Wood answered: "He has made a lot of money, but he has given it away. My information, from a reliable source, is that the president today is not worth a million dollars."
