Side Dress_

TT wasn't much use to plant cotton if the boll A weevils are going to get most of it. All reports indicate that the weevils mean business this year. The warm winter, the late damp spring, the possibility of a wet summer, all point to a very heavy infestation.

A late crop won't stand much chance. If you can set your crop ahead of the weevils, you will be reasonably safe.

If there is one thing that will pick your cotton up and push it right past the weevils, it is Chilean Nitrate. Nothing takes its place for side-dressing cotton.
