#### State Is Ready

### To Meet Every Obligation Now

Can Meet All Bills Due At End Of Year, Governor Gardner Declares.

Raleigh, June 1.—Governor O. Max Gardner this week said the state of North Carolina was prepared to meet "all obligations of every character due and payable at the end of the fiscal year June 30."

The governor and state treasurer, John P. Stedman, conferred late today following which Governor Gardner issued a statement. It said: "Every requirement necessary for prompt payment of the \$5,800,000 interest and principal has been arranged. Of the amount to be paid, \$2,600,000 will be applied to the retirement of bonds and reduction of the state debt."

"The teachers' salaries for the six months term have been paid or provided for and all obligations of every character due and payable at the end of the fiscal year June 30 will be met."

On May 25, the state issued \$5,000,000 in six per cent tax anticipation notes to replace \$3,800,000 in similar obligations maturing at that time and to provide \$1,200,000 for the state treasury.

This, it was said at the time, made it possible for the state to meet its obligations maturing at the end of the fiscal year, June 30. These notes brought to \$7,320,000 the amount of such obligations outstanding for the 1931-32 fiscal year. It was anticipated \$3,000,000 such obligations would have to be issued during the 1932-33 fiscal year.

#### Fugitive Is Back

### After Being Gone For Over 19 Years

Littleton.—Henry Gurkin, fugitive from justice for 19 years, voluntarily surrendered to Officer Gray in Roanoke Rapids last week.

Saturday night, May 3, 1913, Thomas Shaw, a well known farmer and country merchant, living about 12 miles from here, was shot down on the front porch of his home by an unknown person. Mr. Shaw lived several hours but was never able to give a description of the murderer. Robbery was the motive for the crime, but in his haste to get away after shooting Mr. Shaw, the slayer failed to carry the money with him.

Henry Gurkin and Kid Cobb, of Roanoke Rapids, were arrested and charged with the murder and jailed without bond.

They were brought for trial before Judge Henry P. Love and prosecuted by Representative Kerr, at that time solicitor. At the close of the state's evidence, the jury returned a verdict of murder in the first degree against Cobb and Gurkin was exonerated of all charges. Cobb was sentenced to be electrocuted. He died in the chair after making a confession of the whole affair. He implicated Gurkin who was again indicted as an accessory before the fact. He gave bond and then disappeared. Later he was declared a fugitive from justice.

After surrendering to Officer Gray, Gurkin was put under a \$500 bond and will be tried at the next term of Halifax county court.

#### Hickory Woman Cut

### By Angry Husband

Mrs. Lorenzo Goings, in Hospital With 12 Wounds. Husband Held.

Hickory, May 30.—Mrs. Lorenzo Goings, 24, living two miles east of Plateau, was in the Richard Baker hospital today with 12 knife wounds in her back, and her husband is in the county jail at Newton following an attack on her early Sunday evening. The man is held on a charge of assault with a deadly weapon and attempts to kill his wife.

Goings was said to have stabbed his wife in her back and cut her when they were walking to their home after visiting her father, Frank Helms, who lives nearby. She was carrying a three-months-old baby in her arms but kept on walking.

At the home Goings was said to have cut the hand of an 80-year-old relative of his wife when the aged man attempted to keep Goings from slashing her throat.
