Wake Officials To Fight Cut In Their Salaries

Raleigh, Aug. 15.—Wake county officials, elected by their own people, and by them pledged a certain salary, today declined to go into rhapsodies over the demand of taxpayers and county officials that a voluntary cut be taken by all and sundry of these office holders.

The pernicious doctrine that governments have other "sacred" contracts than those of meeting bond maturities and notes given at terrifically high rates of interest, is so spreading that actually the smitten salary earners are making suggestions. There has been from many a high source in the state suggestion that when persons paid salaries are asked to take a cut banks and financial houses of all kinds agree to take their cut in similar way.

Whether this is to become a popular proposal or not is impossible to say now because it is so new. But persons who draw salaries are hiring lawyer to talk back for them.

Durham has had a round of it and now Wake. The Wake officials fortunately do not have to defend very high salaries. They have nobody on this county payroll, for instance, who draws a higher salary than the governor or the chief justice of North Carolina's supreme court.

Former solicitor Leon S. Brassfield presented the case for the salaried class today. These office holders have taken one cut. Solicitor Brassfield thinks another now is unduly hard.

Dr. J. Y. Joyner, president of the Wake County Relief association and member of the budget committee was present at the meeting of the county commissioners. There were no new requests from him and his organization. He thought very well of the proposed budget, which is \$400,000 less than it was before the commissioners worked on it.

The county tax rate is to be about 88 cents. That is regarded fair.

Board Prepares To Loan Money To Burdened Home Owners

Washington.—The board of directors of the new federal home loan discount bank system organized today and immediately began formulating policies to ease the burden on struggling home owners and those holding none-liquid real estate mortgages valued at billions.

President Hoover greeted the bipartisan board of five at the White House shortly after they were sworn by E. W. Libby, chief clerk at the commerce department.

Obviously pleased that the last of his economic rehabilitation projects approved by congress was getting under way, President Hoover cheerfully wished the directors "good luck" in their new endeavors.

Franklin W. Fort of Newark, N. J., former Republican house member who left his banking and insurance business to assume the chairmanship, said:

"We reported to the President that we are on the job and ready to begin work. Our first job is to formulate general policies of the organization."

The directors behind closed doors at the commerce department, studied the problem of creating from eight to twelve districts for as many banks of eleven directors each.

The value of mortgages held on homes worth \$20,000 and less by building loan associations, insurance companies and other financial institutions, will largely determine the districting. Virtually every city has applied for one of the banks.

Each of the banks will have a minimum capital of \$5,000,000. Chairman Fort said as soon as the system was set up, subscription books for stock would be opened. Only in the event the stock is not sufficiently taken will the board resort to the \$125,000,000 capital fund set up by congress through the Reconstruction corporation to complete the subscription, he explained.

The districts will not be identical to the twelve federal reserve districts, the act specifically providing that no states shall be split. This is to prevent confusion over different state laws, Fort said.

Melville Mills Sold For \$50,000

A dispatch from Charlotte under date of the 8th appearing in The Daily News Record says: The Melville mill property on the western outskirts of Lincolnton was sold at auction by Receiver W. W. Glenn for \$50,000. The mill was bid in by bondholders, subject to raise within the usual time limit.

Other real estate holdings belonging to the company as well as yarn stocks in the course of completion brought approximately \$2,500.

Dog Loses His Life In Defending Home

Is Shot Down By Policeman While Officers Are Carrying Out Eviction Order.

San Francisco, Aug. 15.—A shotgun charge Tuesday ended a police dog's defense of the home of his mistress—socially prominent here and abroad—against an eviction order.

"Max" pet of Mrs. Carmen Lampe chased away a deputy and a policeman who tried to serve the order. When the policeman wounded the dog in the leg, Mrs Lampe collapsed on the lawn.

Workers began moving the furniture out, but Mrs. Lampe remaining firmly in the middle of the only remaining bed, defying removal of herself and her three children triplets.

The house is owned by Capt. Earl Evans of the police department. Mrs. Lampe was buying the dwelling and the eviction ordered followed an argument over painting work.
