Effort To Be Made To Recover Gold On Sunken Lusitania

Will Try To Get Treasure Estimated In Millions From Ship Sunk By Germans In 1915.

New York, Dec. 14.—The lure of sunken treasure has brought about a renewed attempt to salvage gold and valuables from the Lusitania.

Since a German submarine sent the giant liner to the bottom of Kinsale, Irish Free State, with a loss of 1,198 lives 17 years ago, and brought the United States into the World war, several plans to salvage her treasure have been projected.

The latest was put forward last year, but no actual work was done. It became known today that the sunken liner finally has been located definitely and a decision reached to begin actual salvage operations early in 1933.

Charles Courtney, president of the American Association of Master Locksmiths, who directed the opening of treasure chests on the treasure chests on the sunken liner Egypt last year, has been engaged to aid in the Lusitania venture.
