Washington, Jan. 27.—Representative Bulwinkle, Democrat of North Carolina introduced a bill yesterday under which the Reconstruction Finance corporation would be authorized to make loans totaling \$1,000,000 to effect postponement of foreclosure on farm mortgages. His proposal is to bring about postponement for two years for farmers who are delinquent either in interest, principal or installments on principal and it would allow advances on unpaid delinquent taxes in arrears for more than one year, provided the taxes were due and unpaid before January 1, 1933.
