Green was en route to New York with one of the large K. & S. trucks when in some manner, according to reports, the big truck trailer tore loose and plunged through the driver's cab Green, it is said, suffered a broken leg and a crushed head. He was taken to a hospital in Petersburg, M. M. Stewart, official of the trucking firm, and Green's wife and two children are en route to Petersburg today.

## Several Changes At City Hall, Others Rumored This Week

#### Most Merchants Use Schedule 3 To Levy Consumers Sale Tax

Shelby Merchants Met Friday  
Majority Fall In One Of Four Classifications. No Tax Under 15c Purchases.

Several methods of passing the new sales tax on to consumers under the new North Carolina law were put into effect here Saturday, but most of the retail establishments are operating under schedule 3 which does not require the consumer to pay on purchases under 15 cents.

A meeting of merchants was held in the court house Friday afternoon and after a thorough discussion of the various schedules, they divided themselves into groups of hardware, general stores, drug store, furniture, and grocery stores in order to decide on which classification their particular kind of business would fall.

There was considerable confusion at first but by today each store has adopted a schedule under which it will operate and indications are that so far as the managers are concerned, it is clear in their minds, but customers will be slow to understand why one store charges a sale tax and another does not.

#### Two-Cent Stamps In Use On Local Mail Here Again

The old two-cent stamp has staged somewhat of a comeback in Shelby—staged it Saturday, July 1.

A reduced postage rate on first class local Shelby mail went into effect Friday midnight.

Letters handled by the Shelby postoffice alone will cost two cents to mail, instead of three.

That is to say, any letter mailed in Shelby for local delivery may carry a two-cent stamp. The same applies to mail to and from rural routes served by the local postoffice.

Any letter addressed for delivery through any other postoffice will be returned to the sender and not forwarded to its destination for postage due.
